Even though we are blessed to live in the great state of Texas with strong abortion prevention laws, we continue to serve the abortion minded. They often consider traveling outside the state for an abortion or acquiring medical abortion pills from other states or countries.

- Because of the generosity of our supporters this year, we were able to upgrade our ultrasound machine. The resolution it offers is an incredible view of the unborn in the womb, and the visual/sound of the fetal heartbeat is amazing. The ultrasound image continues to be one of the greatest tools for the saving lives. With the current Texas law, clients do not always reveal their intent. Therefore, we have now changed our policy to offer an ultrasound to every client with a positive pregnancy test.
- In addition, we were able to donate our prior ultrasound to a pregnancy center close to the New Mexico border. We believe this will help equip this center to save many more unborn lives. Abortion policies currently in effect in New Mexico include the following:
 - Abortion is not restricted based on gestational duration (up to and including late term)
 - State Medicaid funds cover abortion
 - Qualified health care professionals, not solely physicians, can provide abortions
 - State has a shield law to protect abortion providers from investigations by other states; may cover patients and support organizations

 - 40,958 Visits by clients and members of their support groups have been served
